If awarded, funds will be distributed by the end of November, following the receipt of the student's letter of acceptance into a forestry related discipline AND their first semester tuition and textbook receipts.

BENTLEY PRENTICE AWARD 2018

- Scholarships of up to \$5,000 CAD are available for qualified students enrolled in a forestry or forest-sector trades-related program, and only available to children of current Canfor, Canfor Southern Pine, and Canfor Pulp employees;
- Six awards are available and will be divided across our operations;
- Scholarships are targeted at the areas of our business experiencing the largest labour shortfalls including skilled tradespeople, wood products manufacturing graduates, forestry professionals, and process control engineers;
- Priority disciplines for the award include electricians, millwrights, power engineers and heavy duty mechanics.

STUDENTS MUST APPLY, IN WRITING, BY FRIDAY, JUNE 29, 2018 TO DONATIONS@CANFOR.COM AND INCLUDE:

- A copy of the student's registration in an eligible program
- Grade 11 and 12 transcripts
- Cover letter written by the student including the following information:
 - Explain their interest in a career in the forest sector
 - Student's physical mailing address
 - Student's e-mail address
 - Student's date of birth
 - Student's Social Insurance Number (Canada) or Social Security Number (US)
 - The name, employee number, and job title of the Canfor or Canfor Pulp parent or guardian

AWARD DETAILS

- Evaluation of submissions will be primarily based on the student's description of their interest in pursuing a career in forestry;
- Award decisions will be made and winners contacted by July 31, 2018;
- Funds will be distributed by the end of November, following receipt of the student's tuition and textbook receipts;
- Awards are one-time payments, and previous recipients are not eligible to reapply in subsequent years.

This program is separate from other Canfor scholarships and bursaries, including those administered through educational institutions, memorial awards in place at some Canfor facilities, and the bursary program for graduating students from Canfor communities. Recipients should not also receive Canfor-sponsored scholarships or bursaries awarded by a post-secondary educational institution or high school. Students who are accepted to a program but waitlisted will remain eligible for payment of the award for 18 months following notification of award. Proof of acceptance and placement on the program waitlist are still required.
